Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order, Roll Call: President San Felippo called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Trustees present included Eric Stowell, Blaine Werner, Elizabeth Manian, Mike San Felippo, Duane Urbanski, and Barbara Ruege; Keri Wallenkamp absent. Village staff present included Clerk/Treasurer Stephanie Waala and DPW Director Peter Lederer. For additional attendees see attached sign-in sheet.

2. Pledge of Allegiance: Those present stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Approval of June 20, 2022, Village Board Meeting Minutes:

Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Ruege. Motion carried 4-0, Trustee Manian abstained.

4. Public Comments:

- a. Staci Schluechtermann states the village put their names on the grant for the fiber optic and; therefore, should be doing more follow up. There have been barrels on Wind Sail Ct for weeks.

5. Old Business:

- a. Discussion and Possible Action on the recommendation from the Architectural Review Board/ Plan Commission regarding a Conditional Use Permit for 411 Lake St.

Trustee Ruege made a motion to accept the Plan Commissions recommendation and approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Stowell. Motion carried 5-0.

- b. Discussion and Possible Action on the recommendation from the Architectural Review Board/ Plan Commission regarding an addition to a garage at 55 E Shore Dr.

Trustee Ruege made a motion to accept the Plan Commissions recommendation and approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Stowell. Motion carried 5-0.

- c. Discussion and Possible Action on the recommendation from the Architectural Review Board/ Plan Commission regarding an new home at 530-532 RayBern Ct.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to accept the Plan Commissions recommendation and approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Ruege. Motion carried 5-0.

- e. **Discussion and Possible Action on the Water User Rate increase.**

President San Felippo informed the board the village had tasked the PSC to ensure we were charging

the proper rate. 6 years ago they recommended an annual 3% increase which was not approved which has now resulted in the village being 18% behind. The current rate is \$2.66 per thousand gallons and the new rate would be \$3.41 per thousand gallons of water.

Trustee Stowell expresses his concern that the village didn't do the incremental before and now there will be 48.8% increase.

Trustee Ruege inquires as to whom is currently paying the hydrant fee. President San Felippo informs the board the general fund is currently paying the fee instead of the water department.

Trustee Werner inquires as to when was the last time increase that was made. President San Felippo informs the board in 2016 was the last report but the rate was not increases. This increase is just to make the water department whole for now, but could lead to excess funds for projects in the future.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve the recommendation from the PSC for a 48.8% increase with a 3% increase annually, motion was seconded by Trustee Urbanski. Motion carried 4-1, Trustee Ruege nay.

d. Discussion and Possible Action on the Water User Rate increase.

President San Felippo informed the board the increase would be 14.2% because the sewer fund did not have enough to pay its loan payment and the payment had to be taxed to village residents.

Trustee Werner made a motion to approve the recommendation from Ehlers for a 14.2% increase. Motion was amended to have the new rate be effective July 10, 2022, motion was seconded by Trustee Urbanski. Motion carried 4-1, Trustee Ruege nay.

f. Update on the Bertram Fiber Optic project/installation within the village.

President San Felippo informed the board the \$1.3 million was approved June 24th.

Trustee Werner inquires if there is someone the residents can contact for updates. President San Felippo informs the board that every house in the area they will be working received a door hanger with contact info.

Trustee Ruege informed the board that some homes have lost door hangers because of the wind and recommends putting information on the website.

Trustee Werner inquires as to what is the easement for each property. President San Felippo informs the board that each property is different.

6. New Business:

a. Discussion and Possible Action on the approval of a Peddlers, Canvassers, Solicitors & Transient Merchants License to King Wok Chinese Restaurant.

Clerk/Treasurer Waala informs the board that background checks were unable to be done due to the website being down and recommends an approval be contingent upon the checks being completed.

Trustee Ruege inquires as to where will they be allowed in the village. President San Felippo informs the board the license would allow them to operate anywhere within the village.

Trustee Werner made a motion to approve the application contingent upon completion of the background check, motion was seconded by Trustee Stowell. Motion carried 5-0.

b. Discussion and Possible Action on the waiving of the pavilion rental fee on July 26th for the

Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation.

President San Felippo informed the board the Library was unable to accommodate the group size and that is why the pavilion is being requested.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to waive the rental fee for July 26, 2022 event, motion seconded by Trustee Manian. Motion carried 5-0.

- c. Discussion and Possible Action on a request from Random Lake Chamber of Commerce for the Fall Family Fun Festival on Saturday, September 24, 2022.

Trustee Ruege made a motion approve as submitted, motion seconded by Trustee Stowell. Motion carried 5-0.

- d. Discussion and Possible Action on the recommendation from the Personnel Committee to hire a new Office Assistant – Deputy Clerk/Treasurer.

Trustee Ruege informs the board an interview was conducted, and the Personnel Committee would like to present an offer to the candidate they had recently interviewed.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve the recommendation of the Personnel Committee, motion was seconded by Trustee Ruege. Motion carried 5-0.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Ruege. Motion carried 5-0.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Ruege. Motion carried 5-0.

Trustee Ruege made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Manian.

Motion carried 4-0, Trustee Werner abstained.

Trustee Ruege made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Manian.
Motion carried 5-0.

f. Sheboygan County Sheriff’s Office May 2022 Report

Trustee Ruege made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Werner.
Motion carried 5-0.

8. Staff and committee reports:

a. Clerk/Treasurer: Clerk/Treasurer Waala updated the board utility bills have gone out and payments are starting to come in.

CivicReady training will be next week and is still on track to be up and running by the end of the month.

Thank you to Trustees Werner and Urbanski for working the Park attendant station over the weekend. Currently there is no one to work the July 16th shift from 8-1.

Trustee Werner volunteers to work the shift.

b. Public Works: DPW Director Lederer updated the board the county will be starting on Carroll St next week. The curb can’t be done until august, but they will start next week working on ditches.

Treatment plant test boring is being done for the new plant as well as hydrovacating for surveyors.

The hydrovac will also be used to vac the holes for the Jacoby sign as well.

Trustee Ruege request a heads up of when the street sweeper will be coming to her neighborhood so she can contact people in the area to move cars.

c. Committees:

1st and Carroll St Ad-Hoc Committee: Trustee Werner updated the board that the location area for the sign has been agreed upon.

Lake, Parks, and Recreation committee: Trustee Werner updated the board they have received a quote for the tennis court update/conversion to pickleball came in at \$156,000. There is a T-Mobile grant they will apply for that would cover \$50,000.

d. President: President San Felippo updated the board that for the July 9th event he will instruct the park attendants to park cars in the overflow lot first and then in the main lot.

Received a request to formulate a plan for road closures for the fireman’s picnic parade. Possibly the Public Safety Committee could spearhead the project.

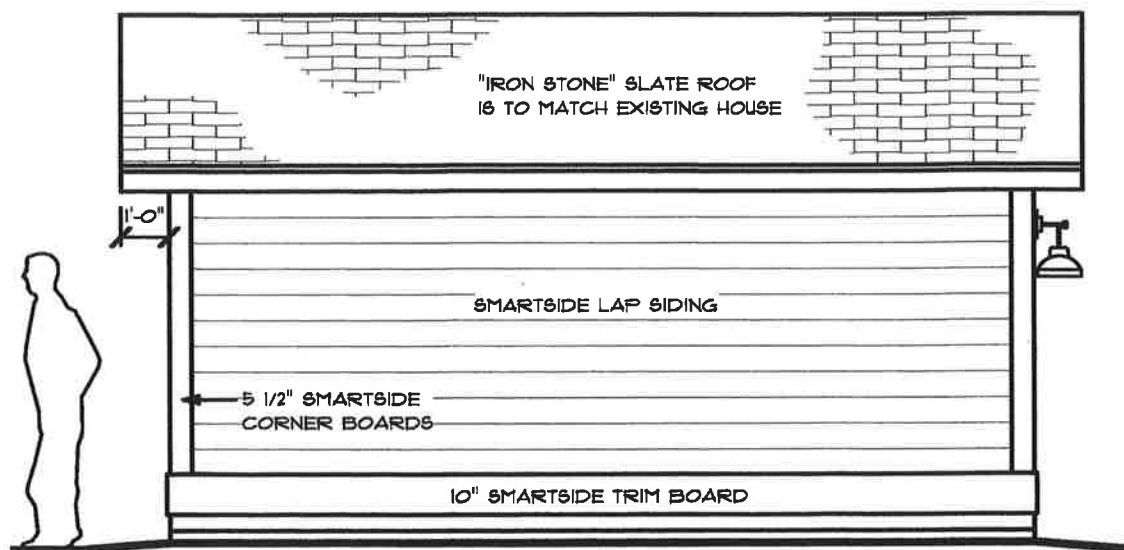

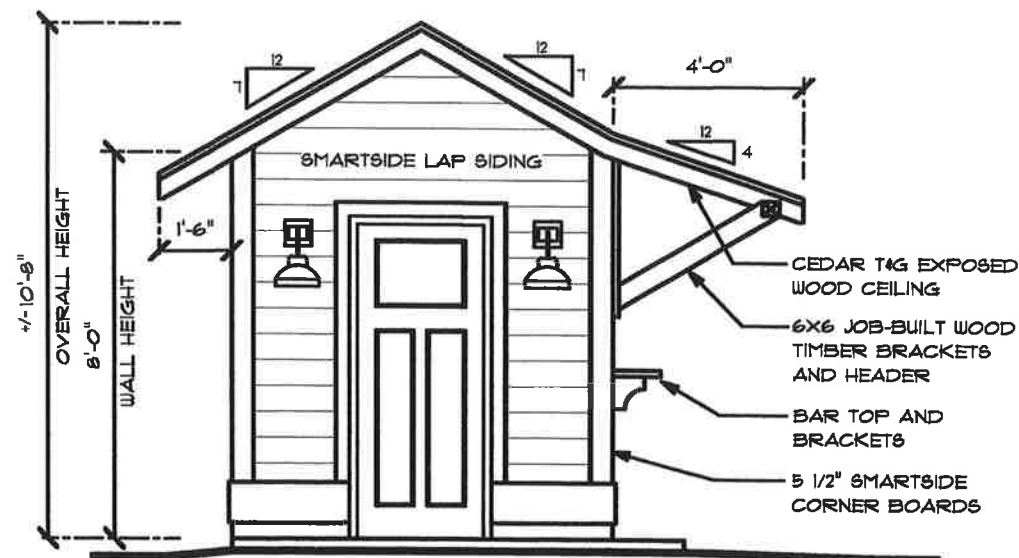
NORTH ELEVATION

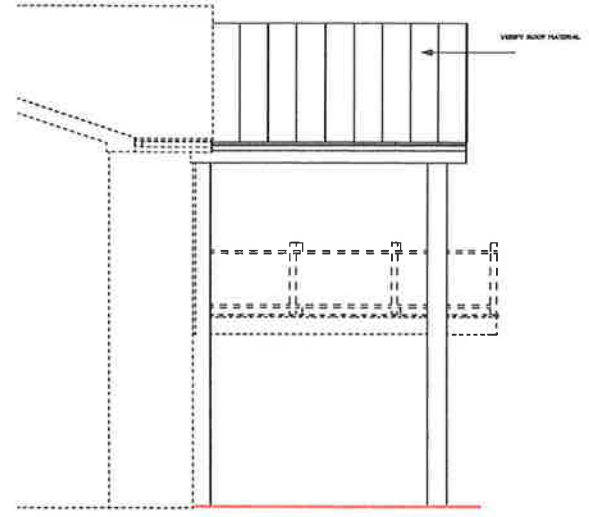

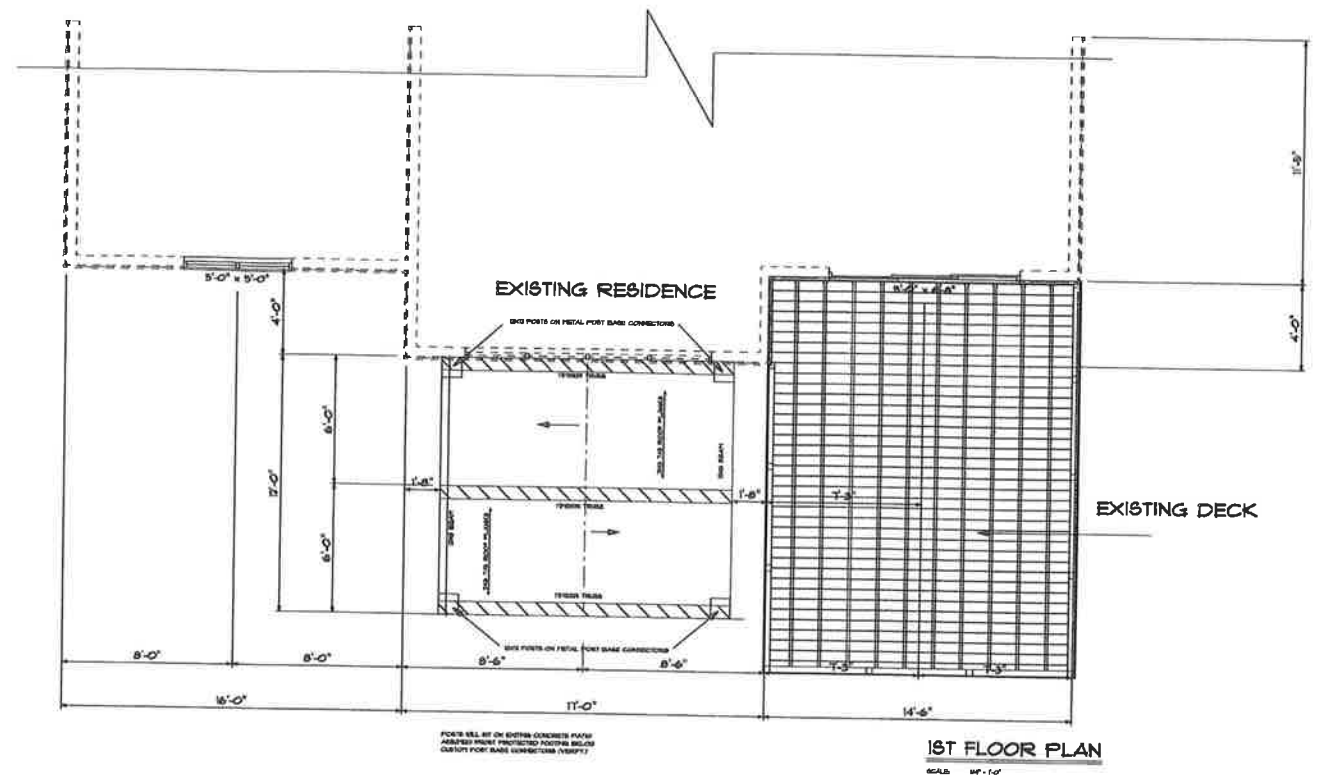
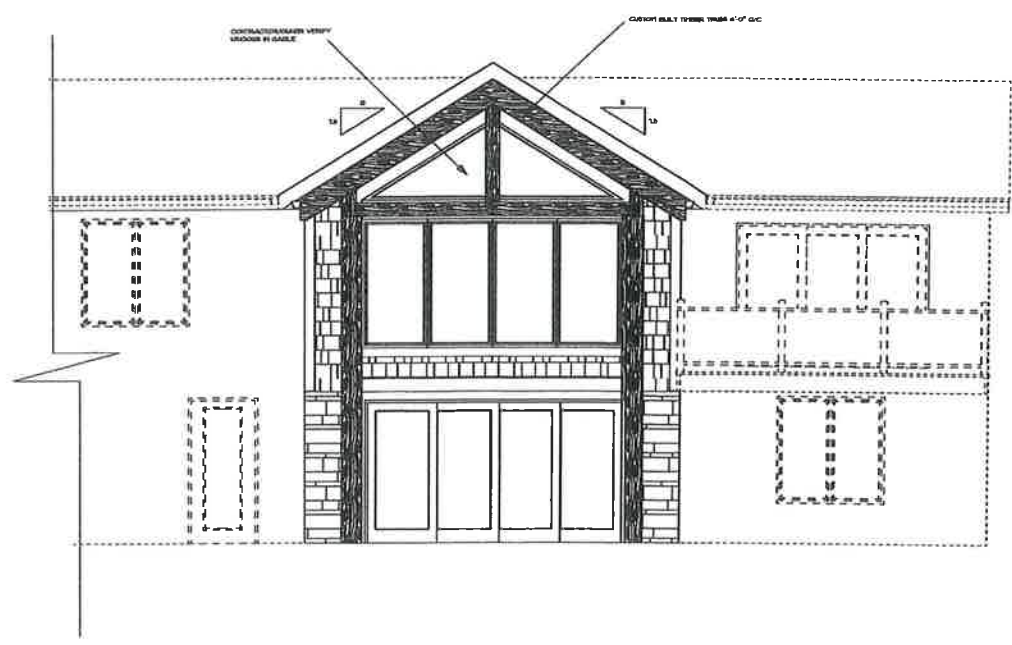
EXISTING REAR ELEVATION



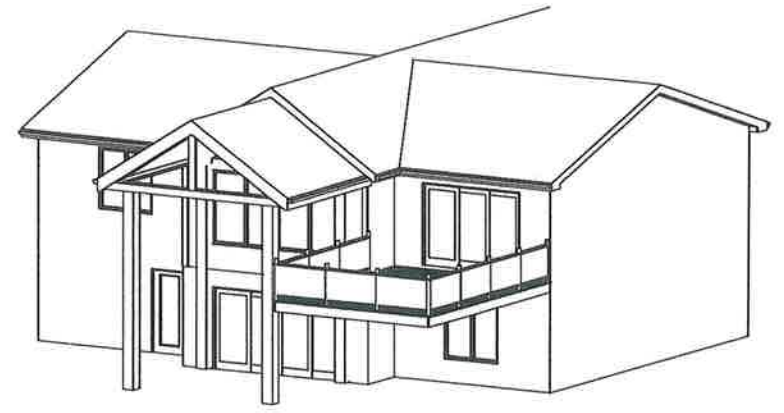

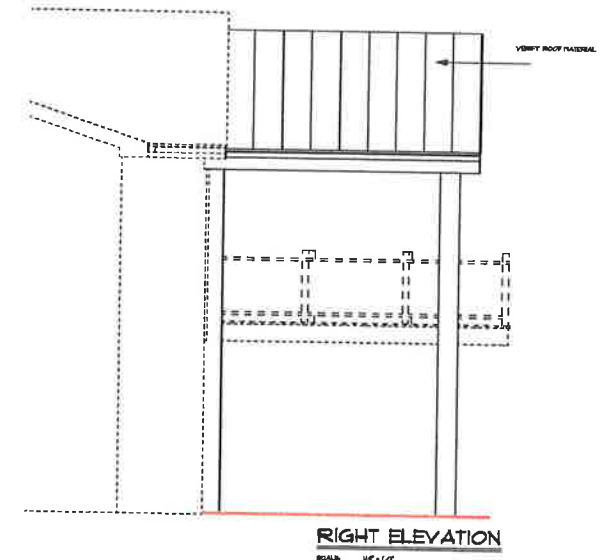

Kapur is pleased to submit this proposal to provide professional engineering services for the referenced project. The project includes the preparation of plans and specifications for the reconstruction of the lift station on East Shore Drive. A site visit was made on July 6, and readings were taken to determine the thickness of the steel can housing the mechanicals of the lift station. Based upon the site visit and discussions with Village staff, our scope of services for the design services are as follows:

- Title searches (3) to verify existing easements
- Topographic survey
- Replacement of motors, pumps, valves, etc.
- Replacement and repair of ventilation system
- Replace the floor and sump crock
- Epoxy the floor and walls
- Addition of cathodic protection
- New controls, cabinet and SCADA
- New backup generator
- Engineering Cost Estimates
- DNR permits
- Preparation of plans, specifications and bidding documents
- Assistance in bidding and award of construction contract

The project is on an accelerated timeline to bid late fall/early winter and to have the reconstructed lift station operational by early summer 2022. Due to availability, the backup generator will likely be delivered and installed several months after all other work is complete.

Our fees for the design as described above, are estimated at \$40,974 (see attached breakdown) and will be charged on a time-and-material basis.

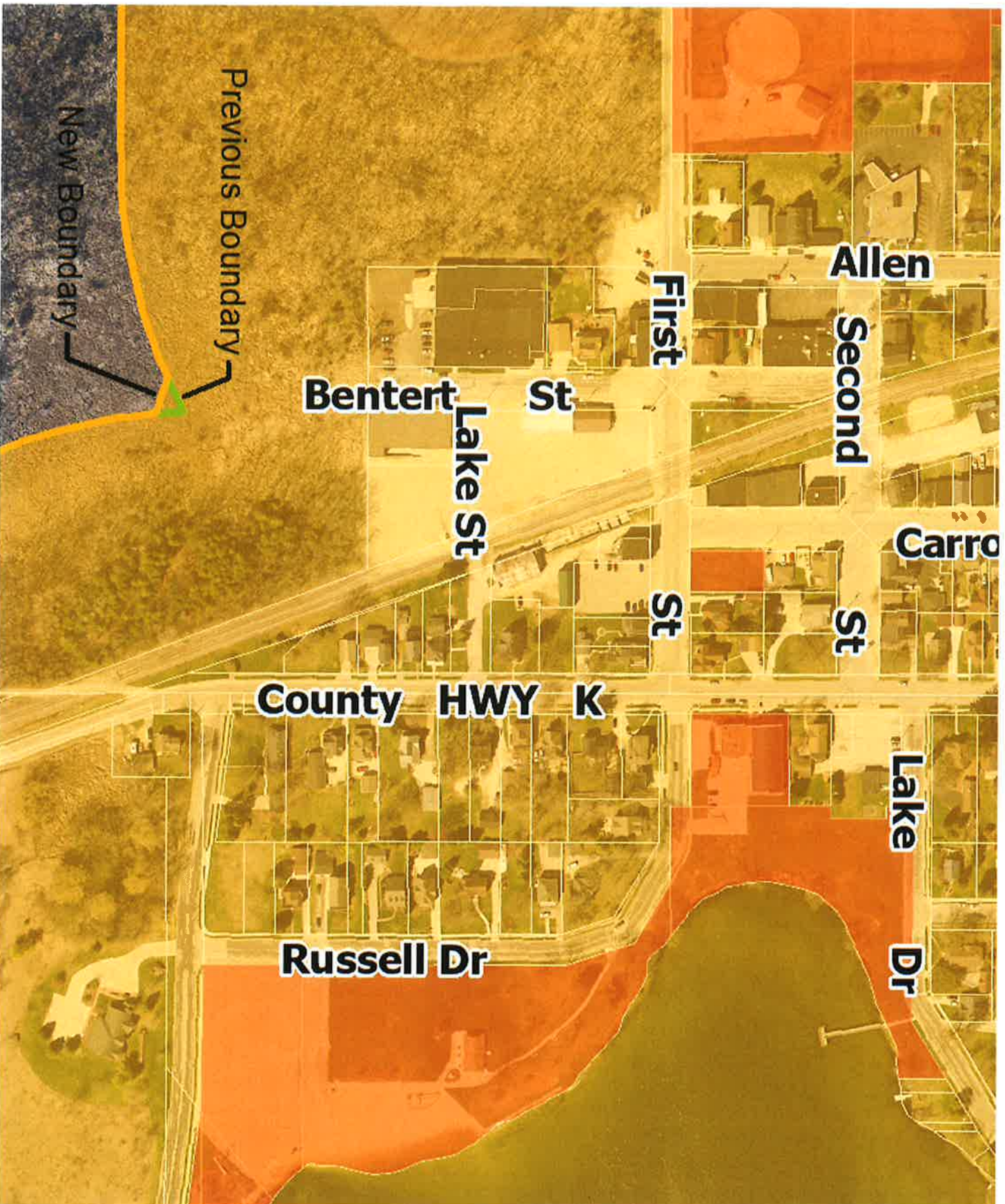

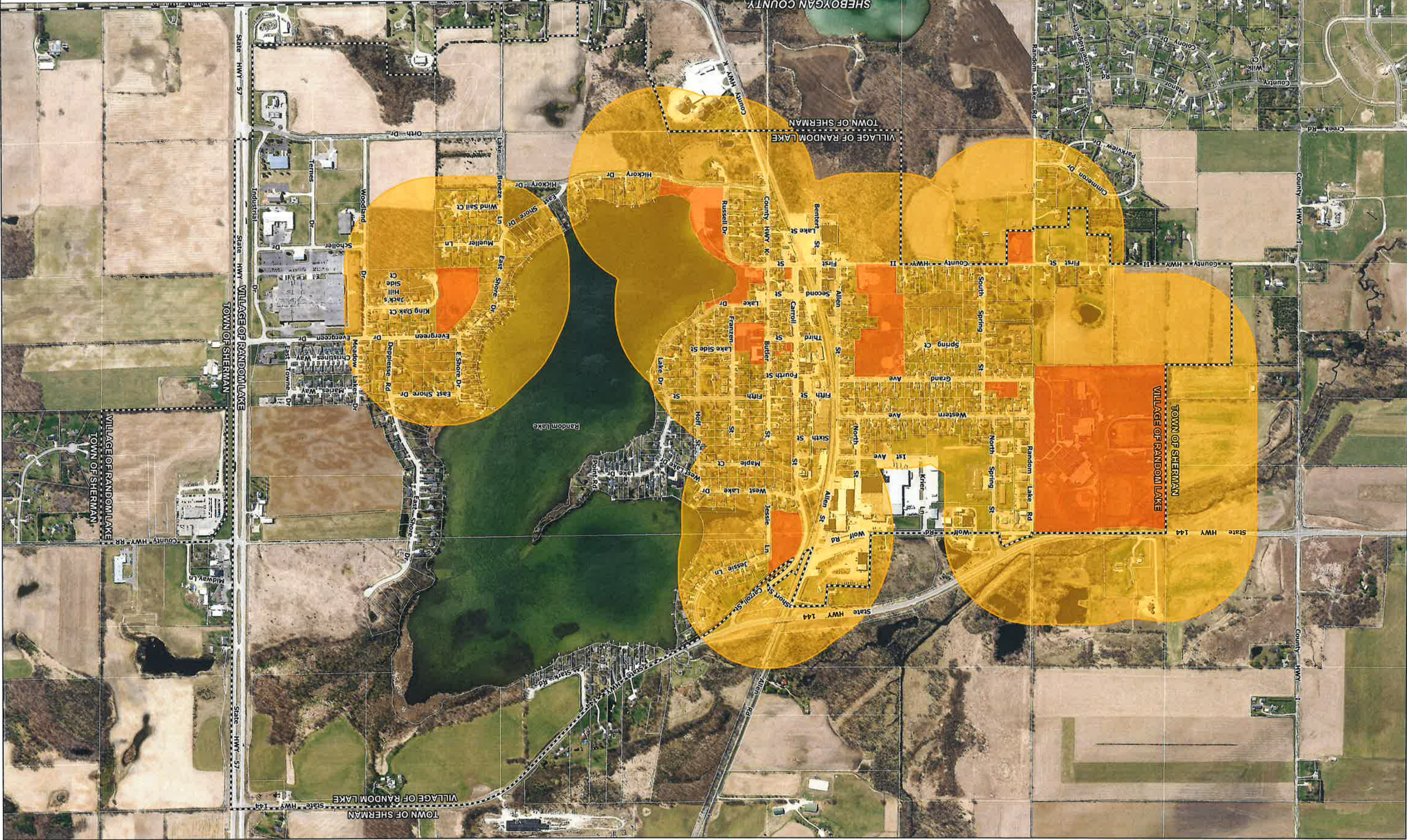
Child Safety Zone

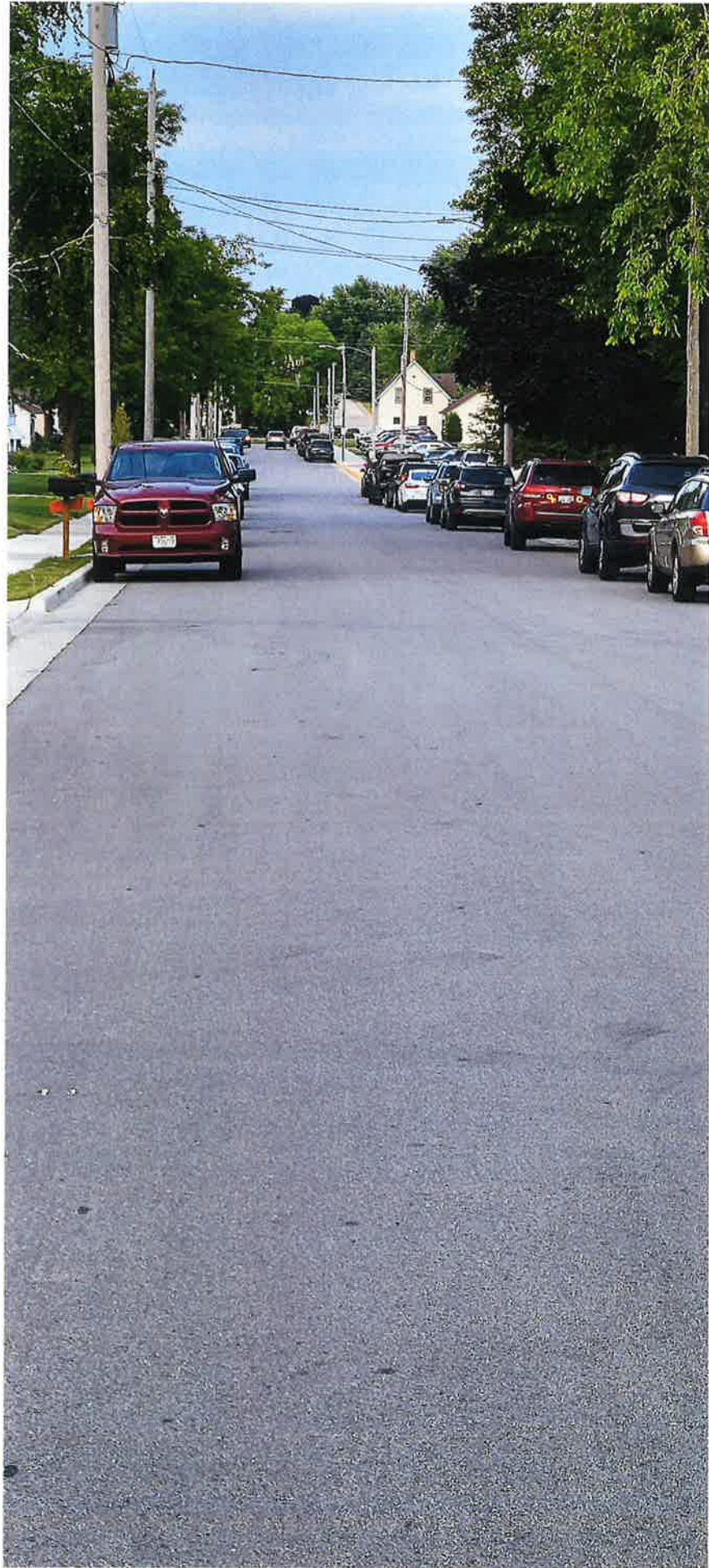

- The applicant must have completed a responsible beverage server training or comparable training course (Stats. 125.17(6)(a))
 - The applicant is not required to complete a training course if:
 - They are renewing their operator's license (Stats. 125.17(6)(a)(1));
 - They have held a retail license, manager's license, or operator's license within the last two years (Stats. 125.17(6)(a)(2)); or
 - They have completed a training course within the last two years (Stats. 125.17(6)(a)(3)).
- The applicant must pay the applicable fee required by municipal ordinance (Stats. 125.17(3))
- The application must be made *in writing* to the municipality (Stats. 125.17(1))
- Operator's Licenses are *only* valid in the municipality that issues the license (Stats. 125.17(2))
- A license can be valid for either 1 or 2 years. This is determined by the governing body of the municipality. Licenses expire on June 30. (Stats. 125.17(3)).

Arrest and Conviction Record

While Wis. Stats. Section 125.04(5)(a)(1) states that applicants cannot have an arrest or conviction record, this is not unqualified. Municipalities are prohibited from denying an operator's license based upon an arrest or conviction record unless that record *substantially relates* to the licensed activity, i.e. serving alcohol.

Wisconsin's Fair Employment Law prohibits discrimination because of an arrest or conviction record. Importantly, Wisconsin Statutes Section 111.335(3)(a)(1) says the following:

(3) Discrimination because of conviction record; exceptions.

(a) Notwithstanding s. 111.322, it is not employment discrimination because of conviction record to refuse to employ or license, or to bar or terminate from employment or licensing, any individual if any of the following applies to the individual:

- 1.
2. Subject to sub. (4) (b) to (d), the individual has been convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, or other offense the circumstances of which ***substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular job or licensed activity.***
- 3.

While Wisconsin Statutes do not define or list what activities "substantially relate" to the job or license, the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development provides further guidance in that regard¹:

An arrest or conviction is "substantially related" to a job when there is some overlap between the circumstances of the job and the circumstances of the offense. For example, a theft related conviction is substantially related to a cashier position. A drunk driving offense is substantially related to a position as a truck driver. However, a drunk driving offense is probably not substantially related to a cashier position.

Further, the Wisconsin Supreme Court recently decided a case on this issue in *Cree, Inc. v. Labor and Industry Review Commission*, 400 Wis.2d 827 (2022). It applied a plain language interpretation to “substantially related” as follows:

The statute requires that these circumstances must “substantially relate” to each other. “Substantial” is defined in Black’s Law Dictionary as “important, essential, and material; of real worth and importance.” Substantial, Black’s Law Dictionary 1728 (11th ed. 2019). We take this to mean that the circumstances must materially relate to each other, not merely superficially relate. We do not take “substantially relate” to mean that the circumstances must be nearly identical to satisfy the test. Indeed, elsewhere in the law “substantially” is used and interpreted to denote a middle ground—a heightened but not extreme standard. **Therefore, the plain language of the substantial relationship test requires that the employer show that the facts, events, and conditions surrounding the convicted offense materially relate to the facts, events, and conditions surrounding the job.**

Therefore, in order for a conviction or pending charge to substantially relate to employment or licensing, there must be a material relationship. Here are a few court decisions that may be instructive:

- a. The Wisconsin Supreme Court found that a prospective police chief was ineligible for that position after it had been discovered he was convicted of 26 felonies for falsifying traffic citations. The court reasoned the public trust and effectiveness required of public officials would be greatly diminished when these felonies were discovered by the public. (*Law Enforcement Standards Board v. Village of Lyndon Station*, 101 Wis.2d 472 (WI 1981)).
- b. The Wisconsin Supreme Court has also found that an armed robbery conviction substantially related to the position of a school bus driver because it showed a “disregard for both the personal and property rights of other persons...” It found these traits were contradictory to the necessary traits to be a bus driver, specifically “patience and level headedness.” (*Gibson v. Transportation Commission*, 106 Wis.2d 22 (WI 1982)).
- c. The Wisconsin Supreme Court also summarized a decision in which it found a previous conviction for misdemeanor patient neglect at a nursing home did substantially relate to a role as a crisis intervention specialist. In this decision, the court analyzed what “circumstances” were relevant for the substantial relationship test. It found that the purpose of the substantial relationship test is to “assess whether the tendencies and inclinations to behave in a certain way in a particular context are likely to reappear later in a related context, based on the traits revealed.” (*Milwaukee County v. LIRC*, 139 Wis.2d 805 (WI 1987)).

Bottom line, the general rule is easy: You can only deny a license if the arrest or conviction record “substantially relates” to the license. While I have been unable to find any case law that directly defines this for operator’s licenses, we can probably identify a few convictions that are likely to substantially relate, such as convictions for disorderly conduct, public drunkenness, and the like in regard to operator’s licenses. There certainly could be others, depending upon the particular details of the application and operations. When analyzing arrest and conviction records, all relevant facts and details surrounding the incident must be considered. This includes considering how much time has passed since the incident occurred. There is likely a difference between someone convicted a single time for disorderly conduct 30 years ago, and someone who has multiple charges, including one in the months before the application. This is not to say an old conviction does not matter, rather, it is to ensure committee members consider all facts and circumstances of any arrest or conviction record. Reviewing the above Wisconsin Supreme Court decisions before alcohol operator license hearings can be helpful to have a clearer understanding of how the laws apply in practice.

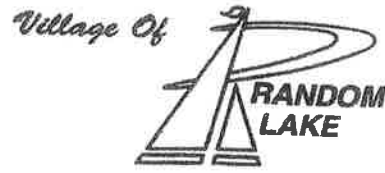
