

- 1. Call to Order, Roll Call: President Bob McDermott called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Roll call showed Trustees present included Mark Bichler, Barb Ruege, Eric Stowell, Elizabeth Manian, Blaine Werner, and Mike San Felippo. Also in attendance were Public Works Director Joe Huiras and Clerk/Treasurer Jo Ann Lesser. For additional attendees please see attached sign-in sheet.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance: Those present stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Action on Minutes from the January 20, 2020 Village Board Meeting: Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve the January 20<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes as presented. Trustee Bichler seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.
- 4. Public Comments: None
- 5. New Business:
  - a. Discussion, Review, and Possible Action on Recommendation from the Personnel Committee to Hire Rebecca Schueller for the Assistant EMS Chief Position: It was noted that the salary is based on 45 work hours per week. Trustee Stowell made a motion to appoint Rebecca Schueller as recommended as the new full-time Assistant EMS Chief for the Random Lake Fire Department. Trustee Manian seconded the motion. Motion carried, 6-0. Trustee Blaine Werner recused himself from the vote.
- 6. Old Business: Trustee Werner questioned if sidewalks were going to be installed on Spring Street between Western Ave and Grand Ave, he suggested quotes be obtained as part of the project.
- 7. Consent Agenda:
  - a. Approval of bills: General Fund: \$62,281.13; Water: \$13,116.01 Sewer: \$19,516.72;
  - b. Sheriff's Department December 2019 Newsletter

Trustee San Felippo made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Trustee Stowell seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.

- 8. Staff and committee reports:
  - a. Director of Public Works: Phil Jacoby is still out on personal leave, Huiras is still completing both jobs. Public Works is taking advantage of the weather and working on trimming trees.
  - b. Committees: Trustee San Felippo stated that the committees met last week to go over the 5 year plans for each. Those forms were submitted to President McDermott.
  - c. President: McDermott explained to the Board that he is looking into screens and projector for the board room for future presentations.

President McDermott moved to item 11 on the agenda.

9. Closed Session: President McDermott read the following notice: Per Wis. Stats. 19.85(1)(e) Deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public funds, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive or bargaining reasons require a closed session, Regarding the following properties: Trustee Stowell made a motion at 6:46 pm to enter into closed session pursuant to chapter 19.85(1)(e). Trustee San Felippo seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Mark Bichler; aye, Barbara Ruege; aye, Eric Stowell; aye, Bob McDermott; aye, Elizabeth Manian; aye, Blaine Werner; aye, Mike San Felippo; aye. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Pursuant to Wis. Stats. 19.85(2) the Village Board will Reconvene into Open Session: Trustee Werner made a motion at 7:52 pm to reconvene into open session. Trustee Stowell seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.

- 10. Discussion, Review and Possible Action on Hiring Ehlers & Associates to Conduct a Feasibility Study regarding the Information discussed in Closed Session: President McDermott made a statement that he would like a motion from the board to proceed with hiring Ehlers to perform a feasibility study to see if the village can support a TID district which would include land owned and possibly sold by the village to Krier Foods. Trustee Bichler made a motion to hire Ehlers & Associates to conduct a feasibility study based on the proposal submitted by Krier Foods. Trustee Manian seconded the vote. Motion carried, 7-0.
- 11. Discussion, Review and Possible Action on Amending Village Ordinance 34-6(c) Parking in Municipal Parking Lots Regulated: Public Works Director Joe Huiras explained the ordinance states there is a permit for parking in municipal lots through his office, Huiras stated he has never issued a permit. Huiras further explained that the sign at the parking lot states that parking is free. Huiras is recommending that the ordinance be amended to reflect current practices. There was an agreement among members that this item needs to be considered and brought back to the board for further discussion and possible action. Trustee Stowell made a motion to postpone this item to the meeting on February 17<sup>th</sup>. Trustee Manian seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.

The Board went back to item 9, closed session portion of the meeting.

12. Adjourn: Meeting adjourned at 7:55 pm.

- (a) Seasonal no parking areas.
  - (1) No person shall park any vehicle on either side of Russell Drive from Memorial Day to Labor Day.
  - (2) No person shall park any vehicle on either side of Hickory Drive from Butter Street to East Shore Drive from Memorial Day to Labor Day.
- (b) Winter parking prohibited. No persons, except physicians on emergency call, shall park any vehicle between 2:45 a.m. and 7:00 a.m., on any village street from the first measurable snowfall to April 1.
- (c) Parking in municipal parking lots regulated. No person shall park a motor vehicle in any municipal parking lot for more than 24 hours unless a permit therefor is issued by the director of public works:
- (d) *Parking in driveways prohibited.* No person shall park or leave standing any motor vehicle in any private driveway without the permission of the owner or lessee of the property upon which such driveway is located, whether or not such driveway is posted to prohibit parking.
- (e) Snow removal and street maintenance. Whenever it is necessary to remove snow or repair a village street or any part thereof, the director of public works shall post such street or parts thereof with appropriate signs prohibiting parking. Such signs shall be erected at least two hours prior to the time that street maintenance work is to be commenced. No person shall park a motor vehicle in violation of such signs.
- (f) Designated parking spaces. The director of public works, shall cause lines or markings painted upon the curb or upon the street or parking lot surface for the purpose of designating a parking space. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any line or marking or to park a vehicle in such position that the same shall not be entirely within the area designated by such lines or markings.
- (g) Leaving keys in ignition prohibited. No person shall permit a motor vehicle in his custody to stand or remain unattended on any street, alley or in any other public place, except an attended parking area, unless the starting lever, throttle, steering apparatus, gear shift or ignition of the vehicle is locked and the key removed.
- (h) Parking restriction for vehicles over 8,000 pounds. No vehicle over 8,000 pounds may park on the street in any R-1 or R-2 district except for the purpose of loading and unloading.
- (i) Parking limitation of buses or recreational vehicles. No buses or recreational vehicles, either motorized or towed, may be parked on any village street between 2:45 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. except in such case as a four-day permit is obtained from the village clerk-treasurer. Applications for a permit shall be made by village residents only and accompanied by a currently valid vehicle registration certificate or valid driver's license and the permit fee, which

It is our intent to provide you with complete information as to the activity conducted by our officers while on Village of Random Lake contract patrol duty. Our hope is that it will be informative and transparent for you.

The Village of Random Lake contracts with the Sheboygan County Sheriff's Office for 84 hours of service per month.
