- 1. Call to Order, Roll Call: President San Felippo called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Trustees present included Mark Bichler, Elizabeth Manian, Barbara Ruege, Michael San Felippo, Eric Stowell (virtually), Keri Wallenkamp, and Blainer Werner. For additional attendees, see attached sign-in sheet. Trustee Stowell left the meeting at 7:44 pm and returned at 8:57 pm.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance: Those in attendance stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Approval of April 5, 2021 Village Board Meeting Minutes: Trustee Wallenkamp made a motion to approve the April 5, 2021 minutes as presented. Trustee Bichler seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.
- 4. Public Comments: None
- 5. Old Business:
 - a. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding ATV/UTV Ordinance for Village: President San Felippo read Kari Noll's letter in opposition of the ordinance. Kari Noll was also in attendance virtually and spoke about her reasons behind her opposition. Discussion regarding the age requirements to operate an ATV on the road was a concern of the Board. There was no decision made by the Board at this meeting due to the ordinance not being updated to the village standard. This item will be placed on the May 3rd agenda.
 - b. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Golf Cart Ordinance for Village: It was noted that the golf cart does need to be registered with the State of Wisconsin as well as the Village. Trustee Werner made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2021-05 Golf Carts. Trustee Keri Wallenkamp seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.
 - c. Possible Action Regarding Launch Pier: This item was not discussed and will be placed on the May 3rd agenda.
 - d. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Estimates from TNT Enterprises, Sheboygan County Highway Department, and Dlapa Construction to Finalize the Kircher Park Project: Director Huiras explained that Sheboygan County quoted 3" asphalt at \$40,000 or 4" for \$50,000 to \$52,000. The project total will be \$114,000. Trustee Wallenkamp made a motion to approve the proposal from Sheboygan County for 4" asphalt for \$52,000, Dlapa for concrete work and TNT Enterprises for \$24,950. Trustee Ruege seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.
 - e. Memorandum of Understanding with Bertram Communications Regarding a Broadband Utility: Trustee Werner made a motion to approve the Memorandum of understanding with Bertram Communications. Trustee Bichler seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.

6. New Business:

- a. Proclamation Designating May 2nd Through May 8th as National Municipal Clerk's Week: President San Felippo read the proclamation honoring Municipal Clerks. Trustee Werner made a motion to approve the proclamation honoring Municipal Clerks and Deputy Clerks May 2nd through the 8th, 2021. All Trustees seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.
- b. Placement of A Street Light on the South Side of Hickory Drive at the Intersection of Butler Drive: The Board discussed the location of the light and felt that more information was needed before a decision can be made. This item will be placed on the May 3rd agenda.
- c. Placement of A Street Light on Grand Avenue: Trustee Bichler made a motion to approve the placement of a streetlight on Grand Avenue. Trustee Manian seconded the motion. Motion carried, 6-0.
- d. Ordinance 2021-4 Establishing Committees and Procedures: President San Felippo explained that he combined some committees, having 8 and bringing that down to 5. Trustee Ruege made a motion to adopt ordinance 2021-04 establishing committees and procedures. Trustee Bichler seconded the motion. Motion carried, 6-0.

- e. Discussion & Possible Action to Accept Quote from Kapur for work on TID-3: Aaron Groh of Kapur & Associates explained that this quote is to complete work for extending sewer and water up County Road RR from Highway 57 to accommodate the addition Eric Von Schledorn will be completing in 2021. This is to include surveying and permitting from WIDOT and Sheboygan County. Trustee Werner made a motion to approve the quote from Kapur & Associates in the amount of \$14,582. Trustee Wallenkamp seconded the motion. Motion carried, 6-0.
- f. Change Order #1 from PTS Contractors for Grand Avenue & Spring Street in the Amount of (\$71,915.02): Trustee Bichler made a motion to accept change order #1 for the 2020 road project with PTS. Trustee Ruege seconded the motion. Motion carried, 6-0.
- g. Pay Request #5 for 2020 Road Project-Grand Avenue and Spring Street in the Amount of \$201,646.26: Trustee Manian made a motion to approve pay request #5 in the mount of \$201,646.26 to PTS. Trustee Ruege seconded the motion. Motion carried, 6-0.

 - a. Clerk/Treasurer: Lesser reported that the new carpeting was installed Thursday and Friday of last week. Deputy Gillette applied for a scholarship to attend classes again this year. There are some other classes coming up this summer that are interesting and Lesser will be looking into taking some.
 - b. Director of Public Works: Huiras reported that the crew continues to work on getting the bathrooms up and running. Completing lawnmower maintenance, will begin cutting grass next week. The fence was removed at the park for the upcoming asphalt work.
 - c. Committees: None
 - d. President: San Felippo stated that Trustees Bichler and Wallenkamp will be attending Government 101 through the League of Wisconsin Municipalities via zoom.
- 9. President San Felippo read the following statement to Consider and Act by Roll Call Vote to Enter into Closed Session Pursuant to SS. 19.85(1)(e) Deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public funds, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive or bargaining reasons require a closed session (Eric Von Schledorn Developer's Agreement, Krier Foods Developer's Agreement). ORDINANCE 2021-06

All-Terrain Vehicle Route Village of Random Lake, Sheboygan County

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES AND REGULATING THE OPERATION OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES

Section I - Intent

The Village of Random Lake, Sheboygan County adopts the following all-terrain vehicle route for the operation of all-terrain vehicles upon all Village roads. Following due consideration of the recreational value to connect trail opportunities and weighed against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created.

Section II - Statutory Authority

Open usage of Village roads is done pursuant to Village authority as authorized by 23.33 (8) (b), Wis. Stats. The applicable provisions of 23.33 regulating ATV/UTV operation pursuant to routes are adopted.

Section III - Routes

All Village roads will be open to ATV/UTV usage unless otherwise posted.

All county and state roadways posted 35mph or less will be open to ATV/UTV usage as authorized under Wis. Stat. s. 23.33(11)(am)4 unless otherwise posted.

Section IV - Conditions

As condition for use of Village roads, the following conditions shall apply to all operators and passengers:

- A. All ATV/UTV operators shall observe posted speed limits.
- B. No person under 18 years of age may operate or be a passenger on an ATV/UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required under Wis. Stats. 347.485(1)(a) and with the chin strap properly fastened, except as specifically exempted under Wis. Stats. 23.33(3g)(b, c and d).
- C. All ATV/UTV operators under 16 years old must be in direct verbal supervision of a parent or legal guardian when operating on a designated all-terrain vehicle route.
- D. Operation of ATVs and UTVs on roadways designated as ATV/UTV Routes are authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway, on the paved surface (if the roadway is paved), except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- E. Approved hand signals are required whenever the operator intends to direction if vehicle is not equipped with turn signals.
- F. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride single file.
- G. The operator of an ATV/UTV shall obey all traffic laws, local ordinances and DNR Regulations.
- H. The operator of an ATV/UTV shall display a lighted headlamp, tail lamp and working brake light on the ATV/UTV and display the registration license plate at all times.
- I. All roads must be signed in accordance with NR 64.12, and NR 64.12 (7).
- J. ATV/UTV operation is at the risk of the operator. The VILLAGE OF RANDOM LAKE has no liability for any damage or injury to persons, real property or personal property, arising out of the operation of ATVs and UTVs on designated ATV/UTV Routes under Wis. Stats. 895.52 (1)(d)(g).
- K. Routes are open year-round.
- L. On all roads shared with another jurisdiction the most restrictive Ordinance shall apply.
- M. The Town reserves the right to open or close routes by a simple Board motion.

Section V - Enforcement

This ordinance shall be enforced by any law enforcement officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

Section VI - Penalties

Wisconsin State All-Terrain Vehicle penalties as found in Wis. Stats. 23.33 (13) (a) are adopted by reference.

Section VII - Severability

The provision of this ordinance shall be deemed severable, and it is expressly declared that the Village would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

ORDINANCE 2021-06

All-Terrain Vehicle Route Village of Random Lake, Sheboygan County

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES AND REGULATING THE OPERATION OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES

Section I - Intent

The Village of Random Lake, Sheboygan County adopts the following all-terrain vehicle route for the operation of all-terrain vehicles upon all Village roads. Following due consideration of the recreational value to connect trail opportunities and weighed against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created.

Section II - Statutory Authority

Open usage of Village roads is done pursuant to Village authority as authorized by Wis. Stats. 23.33 (8) (b). The applicable provisions of Wis. Stats. 23.33 regulating ATV/UTV operation pursuant to routes are adopted.

Section III - Routes

All Village roads will be open to ATV/UTV usage <u>unless otherwise posted</u>. All county and state roadways posted 35mph or less will be open to ATV/UTV usage as authorized under Wis. Stats. 23.33(11)(am)4 <u>unless otherwise posted</u>.

Section IV - Conditions

As condition for use of Village roads, the following conditions shall apply to all operators and passengers:

- A. All ATV/UTV operators shall observe posted speed limits.
- B. No person under 18 years of age may operate or be a passenger on an ATV/UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required under Wis. Stats. 347.485(1)(a) and with the chin strap properly fastened, except as specifically exempted under Wis. Stats. 23.33(3g)(b, c and d).
- C. All ATV/UTV operators must be 16 years or older and carry a valid driver's license.
- D. Operation of ATVs and UTVs on roadways designated as ATV/UTV Routes are authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway, on the paved surface (if the roadway is paved), except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- E. Approved hand signals are required whenever the operator intends to direction if vehicle is not equipped with turn signals.
- F. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride single file.
- G. The operator of an ATV/UTV shall obey all traffic laws, local ordinances and DNR Regulations.
- H. The operator of an ATV/UTV shall display a lighted headlamp, tail lamp and working brake light on the ATV/UTV and display the registration license plate at all times.
