- 1. Call to Order, Roll Call: President San Felippo called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Trustees present included Mark Bichler, Elizabeth Manian, Barbara Ruege, Mike San Felippo, Eric Stowell, Keri Wallenkamp, and Blaine Werner. For additional attendees please see the attached sign-in sheet.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance: All those in attendance stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Approval of February 21, 2022, Village Board Minutes: Trustee Wallenkamp made a motion to approve the February 21, 2022, meeting minutes as presented. Trustee Ruege seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.
- 4. Public Comments: None
- 5. Old Business:
 - a. Discuss and Possible Action Regarding Contracting with Pros4Technology for IT Services: The proposal was reviewed by the Board. It was noted that the const of the contract is \$10,000 per year and it was mentioned that additional quotes should be obtained to make a comparison. Trustee Wallenkamp made a motion to accept the proposal from Pros4Technology for IT services to include the security plus option at \$4,836 with the understanding that a new server be purchased in 2023. Trustee Manian seconded the motion. Motion failed; 3-4.
 - b. Discuss and Possible Action on Amendment #1 to the 2021 General Engineering Services Contract: Trustee Stowell motions to approve amendment #1 to the 2021 general engineering services contract for an additional \$10,000. Trustee Ruege seconded the motion. Motion carried, 7-0.

- b. Public Works: Siegel reported that the crew has been working on snow removal, fixed a watermain break in the 300 block of Lake Drive, the lift station on Hwy 144 has been repaired and they recently installed a new salter on the pick-up truck.
- c. Committees: Trustee Wallenkamp stated personnel will be meeting a few days this week to conduct interviews for the vacant positions within the village. Trustee Werner stated that Lake, Parks & Recreation is still waiting on the quotes.
- d. President: President San Felippo thanked Phil Jacoby and Tyler Siegel for a good job on snow removal and keeping the utility operation running. Skating rink will be closing for the season due to the warm weather.
- 9. President San Felippo read the following notice: Adjourn to closed session pursuant to Wis.
