LAKEVIEW PARK:

PAVILION RENTALS– The facilities are available for your spring and summer events. The cost for rental is \$50 for residents and \$75 for nonresidents. There is also a \$50.00 security deposit required. The available dates can be found on our website or by calling the Village Office.

<u>PET LICENSES: DUE BY</u> MARCH 31ST, 2021

All cats & dogs must be licensed prior to April 1st each year to avoid being charged a late fee of \$10.00 per animal. Licenses are available at the Village Office. The cost is \$6.00/spayed or neutered animal or \$13.00 /nonspayed or neutered. Current rabies vaccination must be on file to process a license.

SEASON BOAT LAUNCH PASSES— 2021 Boat Launch passes for Lakeview Park are now available at the Village Office during regular business hours. Each boat/watercraft requires its own pass. LAKE PROPERTY OWNERS— If the boat/watercraft stays on the lake all summer the launch fee is \$5.00. If it's used on other lakes, you may want to consider purchasing a season pass.

SHORT-TERM RENTALS (30 DAYS OR LESS):

If you plan to rent your property during the calendar year 2021, the property must be licensed with the Village office.

MAIL BOX POSTS-REPAIR OR REPLACE BEFORE WINTER:

If you have a weak or rotting mail box post, this is the time to change it so it is stable for winter. In most cases, a strong post and secure mailbox will withstand the impact of snow coming from a snowplow. Most plow damage occurs when the mailbox projects too far into the street or the post is weak or rotten. Keeping the mailbox projection at least 2 inches behind the back of the concrete curb is recommended. The DPW will examine mailboxes this Spring/ Summer and make a list of mailboxes needing repair. Property owners will be notified, if they are on the list. Any mailboxes from the list not fixed next winter will be at the property owners expense; should they be damaged from the snow or snowplow.

- Building permits are required for new home construction, roofing projects, siding, and certain remodeling projects. If you have questions on whether or not you need a permit, please feel free to call the Village office.
- Wisconsin Statewide Tornado drill is planned for April 15 at 1:45 p.m. and at 6:45 p.m. During this drill, many sirens across the state will sound, weather radios will trigger test alerts, and TV/radio stations will broadcast test messages to help encourage people to practice their tornado safety plans. In the event severe weather is in the forecast for April 15, the test may be postponed to the following day.

<u>It's a Toilet, not a Trashcan—</u> <u>What not to Flush:</u>

People sometimes view the toilet as an auxiliary wastebasket. Unfortunately, many of the items that end up in the toilet can cause significant clogging problems, not only in your home's plumbing but, also for the Village's sewer system and Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Common items that are often flushed that **SHOULD NOT BE:**

- Flushable Bathroom Wipes
- Facial Tissue
- Feminine Hygiene Products
- Cotton Swabs
- Dental Floss
- Grease
- Face Masks

SIDEWALK INSPECTION & REPAIR:

The Director of Public works will be inspecting all sidewalks within the Village Limits for the following conditions:

- 1. Displacement of joints or cracks–1/2 inch or more vertically.
- 2. Cracks or joints that have opened up more than 1/2 inch.
- 3. A settled sidewalk of more than 1 inch caused by utilities or tree roots.
- 4. Sidewalks raised more than 1 inch due to tree roots or heaving.
- 5. Any sidewalk holding water because of slope in wrong direction.
- 6. A slab with more than 3 cracks in it or pieces missing.
- 7. Spalled surface where aggregate is exposed.
- 8. Any other situation which in the opinion of the Director of Public Works creates a public hazard.

After inspection of sidewalks is completed, letters will be sent to affect property owners explaining the amount of sidewalk to be replaced, the reason replacement is required and options for replacement. Also included in the letter will be a deadline for completing the work.
