UPDATES FOR JUNE-JULY:

COMMUNITY MASTER PLAN - The village is in the works to create a village Community Master Plan & Village Needs Assessment. This plan will help create a vision for the village and guide decisions on land use development. Proposals will be presented to the village at the July 17th meeting.

BRUSH/GRASS/WEEDS - Changes were made to the village ordinance pertaining to overgrown yards. A letter will be written informing the property owner of the violation. They will then have 10 days to rectify the infraction. If still not rectified within that time then a \$100 violation will be issued and steps will be taken to cut down the brush/grass/weeds. All costs of personnel and equipment will then be charged to the property owner.

SOLICITORS/PEDDLERS - Within the village it is allowable for solicitors and peddlers to offer sales of goods. However, they must be properly licensed through the village office. During any time of interaction you have a right to request to see their license. If they are unable to provide a license please contact the village hall and/or the sheriffs department for further clarification.

ALCOHOL AT MUSIC IN THE PARK - This year the village has decided to allow sales of fermented beverages at Music in the Park. As an attendee you are still allowed to bring your own and only need to purchase if you choose to do so. Sales will be setup next to the food vendor for the evening.

Lead Service Line Survey

Within the next month each residential property within the village will be receiving a Lead Service Line Survey. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is requiring that all public water systems complete a comprehensive inventory of water services that are connected to the village's water distribution network. You will be given examples on how to test and where to look. Additional questions on the survey will relate to age of home and other types of piping is currently in the home.

OPERATOR/ BARTENDER LICENSES EXPIRE JUNE 30, 2023

Any person 18 or older who is serving or selling alcohol beverages for an establishment must obtain an operators license unless under the immediate supervision of the establishments agent or a person with a operators license. This annual application runs from July 1—June 30

- Boaters should check out the new sign down at the boat launch to reacclimate themselves with the rules of the lake like observing slow no-wake times and marked areas, traversing the lake in a counter-clockwise direction, and swimming as indicated.

Deduct Meters:

Many residents ask “with the change to monthly billing when do I now call in my deduct meter reading?”

- Preferably at the beginning of the month
- If you forget, just call in when you can and dependent on the day it may still be able to be applied to your next billing
- Otherwise it will be applied to the next months billing

What is a deduct meter?

- For properties that use their outside spickets a lot these meters are separate then your water meter as they will track how much water you are using outside your home.
- Monthly you will submit your reading by calling, emailing, or submitting through the website your reading to the village.
- You will still be charged for the water consumption, but credited on your bill for usage not going down the sewer.
- To purchase a meter please contact village hall.
- A plumber will need to install the meter for you and then be inspected by the DPW before use.
