Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order, Roll Call: President San Felippo called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Trustees present included Eric Stowell, Elizabeth Manian, Duane Urbanski, Mike San Felippo, Jeff Schultz, Barbara Ruege, and Keri Wallenkamp. Village staff present included Clerk/Treasurer Stephanie Waala and DPW Director Peter Lederer. For additional attendees see attached sign-in sheet.
2. Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Public Comments on non-agenda items (*limit 3 minutes per speaker*)

Brian Doudna of the Sheboygan County EDC informed the board that Graef was the contractor of choice for the Community Master Plan. The terms of the contract are being finalized and the village will be the co-signer. The SCDEC will finance this contract, but the village will have control of the proceedings. Hoping to start in September. Changes were made to increase community engagement which will also include monthly updates.

4. New Business:
 - a. Discussion and Possible Action on the Recommendation from the Architectural Review Board on the partial fence improvement, residing of garage, and residing of shed at 639 1st St.

President San Felippo informed the board the Architectural Review Board recommended approval as submitted.

Trustee Urbanski made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Wallenkamp. Motion carried 7-0.

- b. Discussion and Possible Action on the Recommendation from the Architectural Review Board on the construction of a new home at 95 McDermott Ct.

President San Felippo informed the board the Architectural Review Board recommended approval as submitted.

Trustee Urbanski made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Manian. Motion carried 7-0.

- c. Discussion and Possible Action on potential development.

Brian Depies, Nate Altheimer, and John Rassel presented to the board plans for a 4.5-acre parcel in the Town of Sherman on the north side of Cty Rd RR. 21 buildings ranging in size to be built to be used by small businesses or storage for individuals. Timeframe would be to start in Spring 2024 and build 5 units at a time. This parcel would need to be annexed to the village to get water and sewer.

Trustee Urbanski inquired as to if fire equipment would be eligible to get through as well as large car haulers. Mr Depies informed the board it would be.

Trustee Wallenkamp inquired as to what the expectations of the village would be. Mr Depies informed the board they would expect potential expansion of the TIF.

Blaine Werner, 159A E Shore Dr, inquired as to what kind of sprinkler system these facilities will have. Mt Altheimer informed the board that they will have no sprinklers.

Dale Krier, 98 Butler St, inquired as to if the annexing can be done within their timeline. President San Felippo informed the board that this is a reasonable timeframe.

Clerk Waala inquired as to if this has been presented to the Town of Sherman. Mr Depies informed the board that it has not been presented to the town, but they were informed it would be presented to the village.

d. Discussion and Possible Action on the request of the Lakeview Library Endowment mailing.

Library Director Camrin Sullivan informed the board that the request is to include the endowment mailer with the utility billing or do a separate mailing as the Village of Adell, Town of Scott, and Town of Sherman are doing. The mailer is to request funds for building upgrades and self-checkouts. The cost of the printing and mailing would fall on the village.

Trustee Urbanski made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Stowell. Motion carried 7-0.

e. Discussion and Possible Action on the Recommendation of the Lake, Parks, and Recreation Committee to approve Ordinance 2023-11 related to Parks and Recreation.

Blaine Werner, 159A E Shore Dr, inquired as to the change to the dogs being allowed in the boating area. Requested the board consider that boaters take their dogs on their boats, so change it to loading and unloading only. President San Felippo informed the board that the intent was to keep dogs out of the boat launch area mainly for playing. Suggested changing the wording to include water in section1.

Trustee Stowell inquired as to why the hours would be changing. President San Felippo informed the board that the was so all parks are consistent in hours.

President San Felippo is concerned with the wording of what is authorized and unauthorized vehicles. Would vehicles who rent the pavilion be able to park up there as it is meant specifically for band events.

Item was sent back to the committee for further review.

- f. Discussion and Possible Action on the Recommendation of the Lake, Parks, and Recreation Committee to approve the Fee Schedule updates

Trustee Wallenkamp made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Urbanski. Motion carried 7-0.

- g. Discussion and Possible Action on the Village Engineers proposal for the E Shore Lift Station

Brandon Flunker and Diane Thoun of Clark Dietz informed the board they did a site visit with Peter at the lift station. There are concerns of structural integrity and location. Do not believe it is possible to salvage at current location. Peter has talked with neighboring property to potentially get easement.

Trustee Manian inquired as to does the housing of the station to remain above ground. Mr Flunker informed the board that it could be above or below ground.

Trustee Stowell inquired as to is the location has been confirmed. Ms Thoun informed the board that talks are being done but nothing has been approved.

Trustee Urbanski made a motion to approve as submitted with funds to be taken out of the Sewer Depreciation Fund, motion was seconded by Trustee Stowell. Motion carried 7-0.

5. Old Business:

- a. Discussion and Possible Action on the request to record all board and committee meetings.

Clerk Waala informed the board that clarification from the village attorney was that if recordings were used for creation of meeting minutes then the minimum dates required to keep would be 90 days.

Trustee Wallenkamp inquired as to if it is requested for viewing does it then become a public record which is then needed to be kept for 180 days.

Clerk Waala will present the additional questions to the village attorney for verification on what the this record would truly be.

- b. Discussion and Possible Action on the approval of August 8, 2023 – June 30, 2024 Operator License for Jennifer L Schmitz

Clerk Waala informed the board that clarification form the village attorney was that the application could not be denied but a contingency of a letter to the application requesting verification that the parole officer was notified of the issuance of the license could be sent. Additionally, the license would be issued to be used throughout the village and if the applicant violates her probation and works at a tavern that would be an issue to be addressed by their probation officer.

Trustee Ruege made a motion to approve the recommendation of the village attorney to approve contingent on receipt of a letter from her probation officer stating they are aware of the issuance of the license, motion was seconded by Trustee Wallenkamp. Motion carried 7-0.

- c. Discussion and Possible Action on the approval of the Child Safety Zones

Clerk Waala informed the board the map was updated to include the new park off of Orth Dr.

Trustee Stowell made a motion to approve as submitted, motion was seconded by Trustee Manian. Motion carried 7-0.

- b. Public Works: Parade closures were in place for the parade, complaints from some residents that they were not informed. Currently there are contractors at the plant looking at repairs and this will be presented to the committee when quotes are received.
- c. Committees:
 - Personnel – need dates from for employee reviews. Will be hiring a new WWTP operator.
 - Finance – will be meeting Monday at 6pm
- d. President: reminder to residents to cut grass and ensure vehicles are registered and operating.




PARTIAL FENCE IMPROVEMENT

Replacing approximately 55 ft length of existing fence and gate for safety/access and esthetics.

1. Replacing street-facing fence and gate located from back corner of the house to approx. 6 ft from east lot line. Replacing 6 ft high black galvanized vinyl-coated chain link with 6 ft high black powder-coated aluminum picket style (5/8" square pickets spaced 4-3/8" OC). Panels = 6'x6'. Replacing 3 ft wide chain link gate with 4-5 ft picket-style gate, matching new picket panels.



2. Move existing front 3ft wide chainlink gate to back of garage, which would require 1 additional gate post at that new location.

GARAGE (approx. 14'x22')

Existing siding: Asphalt siding, painted white (exposed = 13" lap style).

Replacing with LP Smartside, lap/cedar texture 6-6.5" exposure, to match existing house (Blue). Trimmed with LP Smart cedar texture trim, (white) to match existing house.

SIDING

'SHED' (approx. 14'x28')

Existing siding: 3 sides, plywood panel siding (vertical), batten appearance, painted light green. Backside gray asphalt siding (exposed = 13" lap style). Replacing with LP Smart panel, (vertical) batten appearance, cedar texture (medium green). Trimmed with LP Smart cedar texture trim, (white) to match house and garage trim.






EXISTING FENCE FRONT







ORDINANCE NO. 2023-10

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTION 26-1(i); 26-1(k); 26-1(n); 26-2(r); and 26-3(a-b) RELATED TO PARKS AND RECREATION IN THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF RANDOM LAKE, SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, the Village of Random Lake adopted the Parks and Recreation Code of Ordinances 1994, followed by several amendments that have been enacted, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Random Lake believes it is in the best interest of the Village to regulate activities at the village parks; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Random Lake, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Chapter 26 of the Village of Random Lake Municipal Code entitled “Parks and Recreation”, Section 26-1 entitled “Park and playground rules and regulations”, Subsection (i) is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:

(i) Animals shall not be allowed in the park except on a leash no longer than six feet. Animals must be attended at all times. Owners shall clean up after animals. No animal shall be permitted ~~on the beach or in the swimming area of Lakeview Park.~~ within the boat launch area due to safety reasons.

SECTION 2: Chapter 26 of the Village of Random Lake Municipal Code entitled “Parks and Recreation”, Section 26-1 entitled “Park and playground rules and regulations”, Subsection (k), is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:

- (1) Lakeview Park, 6:00 a.m. to ~~10~~ 11:00 p.m.
- (2) Kircher Park, 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
- (3) Bertram Park, 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
- (4) Burr Oak Park, 6:00 a.m. to ~~10~~ 11:00 p.m.

SECTION 3: Chapter 26 of the Village of Random Lake Municipal Code entitled “Parks and Recreation”, Section 26-1 entitled “Park and playground rules and regulations”, Subsection (n) entitled “Parking prohibited at Lakeview Park” is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:

(n) *Parking prohibited at Lakeview Park.* Parking on the ~~drive-way~~ sidewalk at Lakeview Park from the parking lot to the pavilion is prohibited to all unauthorized vehicles. Vehicles may drive upon the ~~drive-way~~ sidewalk for immediate loading and unloading only.

SECTION 4: Chapter 26 of the Village of Random Lake Municipal Code entitled “Parks and Recreation”, Section 26-2 entitled “Boating regulations”, Subsection (r) entitled “Water exhibition and race authorized area” is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:

(r) *Water exhibition and race authorized area.* A water exhibition and race authorized practice area on Random Lake is described as follows: an area designated to be the location of the event as indicated in the permit after considering the type and size of the event. The permittee’s use of this area is limited to the ~~following~~ days and hours: (list the days and hours). [listed on the permit](#).

SECTION 5: Chapter 26 of the Village of Random Lake Municipal Code entitled “Parks and Recreation”, Section 26- entitled “Beach regulations”, Subsection (a-b) entitled “Grilling, barbecuing prohibited; Smoking ad use of tobacco products prohibited” is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:

- (a) *Grilling, barbecuing prohibited.* Grilling, barbecuing or otherwise cooking food with gas, wood, charcoal or any other heating source is prohibited on the beach. [Any person not complying shall pay a fee as provided in the village fee schedule.](#)
- (b) *Smoking and use of tobacco products prohibited.* Smoking of all kinds, including but not limited to, the smoking of cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, vapor cigarettes, and all other tobacco products are prohibited on the beach. [Any person not complying shall pay a fee as provided in the village fee schedule.](#)

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and posting or publication as provided by law.

On behalf of Clark Dietz, Inc., thank you for meeting with me regarding the E. Shore lift station replacement. I am pleased to offer this engineering design services proposal.

In general, the lift station project consists of complete replacement of an existing station located in a residential neighborhood. We understand that the Village is in discussions with the owner regarding use of the property.




