There is also \$2,000 included for interest on the loan and \$140,000 for incentives to Schuh Industries that will be paid back through the tax increment process. Trustee Ruege made a motion to approve borrowing \$217,000 for 10 years at 2.95% from Collins State Bank. Trustee Stowell seconded the motion. Motion carried, 4-0.
 - Discuss and Possibly Approve the Waiving of the Village Winter Parking Restrictions Until January 3rd: Trustee Ruege made a motion to temporarily lift winter parking restrictions beginning December 22, 2021 and going back into effect on January 1, 2022. Trustee Stowell seconded the motion. Motion carried, 4-0.
- 5. Adjourn: The meeting adjourned at 9:13 am.
